## Teaching Children to Think for Themselves

Jessica Spada, owner and director of Magical Journey Learning Center, has 25 years of teaching experience with children ages six-weeks through 12 years old. Even with the responsibilities that accompany an owner and director, Mrs. Spada continues to be involved in the classrooms, which she loves.

In addition to shaping young minds, Mrs. Spada loves to create unique hands-on learning experiences for the children, special activities specifically geared towards the development of each child in the class, and family activities, such as Mad Science Workshops, Foam Parties, Santa on the Fire Truck, Fall Festivals, Family Day at the Park, and Dear Ones Day. She says, "The home/school connection is so important."

Mrs. Spada says of her path, "I was very lucky in that I have always known what I wanted to do with my life. When I was seven and my 1st-grade teacher, Mrs. Hall, asked us to write down what we wanted to be when we grew up, my answer was 'I want to be a teacher."

Mrs. Spada explains, "Before my mother passed away in 2015, she gave me all my childhood memories she had been saving ... It was so cool to see that note to Mrs. Hall!
